You will make two of these blocks. Make them the same or different. Instructions are for one block.

Cutting instructions:

Background fabric:

Cut [2] 2" x wof fabric strip

Sub-cut [1] 2" x 25" strip [B]

Sub-cut [1] 2" x 27" strip [C]



Cut [1] 2" x wof strip


Sub-cut [1] 2" x 27" strip [C]


Cut [2] 3-1/2" squares [A]

Dark print:

Cut [1] 2" x wof strip

Sub-cut [1] 2" x 25" strip [B]





Piecing instructions:

Sew the 2" x 25" background fabric [B] together with the 2" x 25" dark print [B] fabric. Press towards the darker fabric. Cut into 2" x 3-1/2" rectangles. Sew together into four patch blocks. They should measure 3-1/2" square.




Sew the two [C] strips together. [2" x 27" strips] Press towards the darker fabric. Cut into [4] 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles.




Lay the block pieces out like the pattern. Sew a 3-1/2" square to a 4 patch. Press towards the 3-1/2" square.


Repeat until you have two. Sew these together. Press either direction. This is the center of the block. It should measure 6-1/2" square.





Sew a [C] unit rectangle to each side. Press towards rectangle. It should measure 6-1/2" by 12-1/2".





Lay your center section of your block back with the remaining pieces.

Sew a four patch block to each end of the remaining rectangles. Press towards rectangles. Be sure the dark squares in the four patches are in the same row as the medium fabric. They should measure 3-1/2" x 12-1/2".



Sew these units to the block center. Press towards the rectangles. Your block should measure 12-1/2"
